Building on the Success of the 2019 Delta Science Solicitation


- Announced Fall 2018

 - 26 projects total













What science will the 2020 Delta Science Solicitation request?

All proposals must pertain to action areas in the 2017 – 2021 Science Action Agenda; a collaborative document developed by the Delta Science community



New: Invitation for large, interdisciplinary projects that integrate social and natural sciences



Action Requested of the Stewardship Council

❖ Recommendation to Approve a cooperative agreement with the United States Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) for the Council to receive and administer up to \$3,500,000 for the period of September 2020 to September 30, 2025. This funding is for Council staff time and science research contracts resulting from the 2020/2021 Delta Science Research Proposal Solicitation.
