### **Meeting Location**

## **Purpose**

The Delta ISB will meet regarding its current reviews and efforts. This includes a discussion on any public comments received on the Delta ISB's latest draft report: "The Science of Non-native Species in a Dynamic Delta," which was prepared as part of the Delta ISB's responsibility to provide scientific oversight of programs that support adaptive management of the Delta. Based on the discussion, the Delta ISB may take action on next steps to address any public comments received to date on the draft report. In addition, the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) will provide an update and overview of the Delta Conveyance Project and the Delta ISB will discuss a potential Delta ISB review of the draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the project. This item will include perspectives from the Delta Protection Commission on Delta as Place considerations in producing an EIR for the Delta Conveyance Project that is based on the best available science.

This will be the last meeting of Dr. Liz Canuel, Dr. Tracy Collier, Dr. Dick Norgaard, Dr. Vince Resh, and Dr. John Wiens, whose terms on the Delta ISB end on August 31, 2020. Dr. John Callaway, whose term as Delta lead scientist ended on July 31, 2020, will also attend. At the meeting, the outgoing Delta ISB members and Dr. Callaway will share reflections on their respective terms and their experiences working in the Delta system. Incoming Delta ISB members, whose terms will start on September 1, 2020, have been invited to the meeting and will be introduced.

Delta ISB Chair Dr. Liz Canuel will call the meeting to order and establish a quorum. Incoming Delta ISB members, whose terms will start on September 1, 2020, have been invited to the meeting and will be introduced.

Alf Brandt, General Counsel to the Speaker of the California State Assembly, will provide an overview of the Delta Reform Act, which he helped draft, and his perspectives on the Legislature's intent and why the Delta ISB was created.

b. Overview of the Delta ISB Review Process

Delta ISB Chair Dr. Liz Canuel will describe the Delta ISB review process, as described in <u>Appendix G of the Delta Science Plan</u> ("Delta Independent Science Board Review"). In addition, she will provide an overview of current reviews and on progress made with developing and selecting future review topics, as summarized in the document titled "<u>Planning</u> Future Delta ISB Reviews."

- 5. Delta ISB Updates and Discussion on Current Reviews
  - a. Ecosystems (Non-native Species) Review (Action Item)

The Delta ISB is in the process of reviewing the adequacy of the science by various programs to predict and explain the effects of non-native species in Delta ecosystems, and the potential for controlling current and future invaders. On July 20, 2020, the Delta ISB released a draft report: "The Science of Non-native Species in a Dynamic Delta" for public comments, which are due on August 24, 2020. At the meeting, the Delta ISB will discuss any public comments received to date. Based on the discussion, the Delta ISB may take action on next steps to address any public comments on the draft report. For more information on the scope of the review, please refer to the Delta ISB's ecosystems review prospectus.

#### b. Water Supply Reliability Review

The Delta ISB is undertaking a review of the scientific efforts and methods by various programs to estimate and evaluate water supply reliability. For more information on the scope of the review, please refer to the Delta ISB's <u>water supply reliability review prospectus</u>.

#### c. Monitoring Enterprise Review

The Delta ISB is undertaking a broad review of the Delta monitoring enterprise, which is the full suite of monitoring activities that occur in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and Suisun Marsh. The review has two components. Component 1 is the development of a comprehensive inventory of monitoring activities in the Delta, which is now complete (see <a href="Component 1 summary">Component 2</a> is the Delta ISB's assessment of the Delta monitoring enterprise, which will be based on the information obtained in Component 1 and other information gathered by the Delta ISB during its review.     - a. Interagency Ecological Program Review

The Delta ISB has completed its review on the Interagency Ecological Program's ability to provide the science necessary to support management of the Delta (see <u>final report</u>) and will discuss recent and upcoming outreach efforts to assist the leadership of the Interagency Ecological Program with implementing the recommendations from the review.

#### b. Science Needs Assessment (Action Item)

Based on the <u>recommendations from the Delta ISB</u> and the endorsement of the Delta Plan Interagency Implementation Committee (DPIIC), the Delta Stewardship Council is in the process of developing a long-term Science Needs Assessment, as part of the <u>Delta Science Funding and Governance Initiative</u>. The Science Needs Assessment will identify key science efforts to provide long-term management insights in the context of rapid environmental change and recommendations for organizing the science enterprise to better address complex and changing problems.

To help inform the Science Needs Assessment, the Delta Stewardship Council is hosting a four part-discussion series in the summer of 2020 and planning a workshop for the fall of 2020 (see <a href="mailto:save-the-date flyer">save-the-date flyer</a>). In addition, the Delta ISB is assessing the implications of rapid environmental change for undertaking research to support management in

the Delta, as described in a <u>recent memorandum</u> to the Delta Stewardship Council and DPIIC. Currently, the Delta ISB is in the process of preparing a journal article on the topic. At the meeting, the Delta ISB will discuss progress made on the Science Needs Assessment itself and the journal article. Based on the discussion, the Delta ISB may take action on next steps.

In the letter, the Delta ISB invited DWR to attend a future Delta ISB meeting to discuss: (1) the process and timeline for a Delta ISB review of the draft EIR for the Delta Conveyance Project; and (2) Delta ISB insights and expectations based on its previous review of EIR documents for the Bay Delta Conservation Plan and California WaterFix. In response to the comment letter, Carrie Buckman of DWR will provide an update on the Delta Conveyance Project and discuss a potential Delta ISB review.
