Purpose

The Delta Independent Science Board (Delta ISB) will meet to discuss its reviews and activities. The meeting will kick off with the Delta ISB's seminar series on decision-making under deep uncertainty. Alice Hill, the David M. Rubenstein senior fellow for energy and the environment at the Council on Foreign Relations and former special assistant to President Barack Obama, will provide an overview of the challenges and benefits of planning for extreme events, as well as effective ways to organize government entities around these issues.

After the seminar, the Delta ISB will discuss its business matters, including the draft prospectus of its review on decision-making under deep uncertainty and the potential reappointment of the Delta lead scientist.

The Delta ISB, with support from the Delta Science Program, is hosting a seminar series to explore concepts from decision-making under deep uncertainty and present tools that can help managers and stakeholders evaluate and plan for a wide range of plausible futures in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The seminar series will help inform the Delta ISB's review of decision-making under deep uncertainty.

Alice Hill, the David M. Rubenstein senior fellow for energy and the environment at the Council on Foreign Relations and former special assistant to President Barack Obama, will kick off the seminar series at this meeting. The United States Geological Survey and the Delta Stewardship Council are in the process of recruiting the next lead scientist for the Delta Science Program, as Dr. Laurel Larsen, the current lead scientist, is about to complete her three-year term in August 2023. The Delta Stewardship Council appoints the Delta lead scientist after consultation with the Delta ISB, pursuant to California Water Code section 85280(b).

Pursuant to California Water Code section 85280(b)(2), the Delta lead scientist can serve up to two terms. The Delta ISB will discuss in closed session whether to recommend to the Delta Stewardship Council to reappoint Dr. Larsen to a second term. Based on the discussion, the Delta ISB may take action on the recommendation of reappointment of the Delta lead scientist.

This closed session is authorized under Government Code section 11126, subdivision (a).
