## **PURPOSE**

The Delta Stewardship Council's Delta Science Program is sponsoring a workshop to train members of the Sacramento River Temperature Task Group (SRTTG)<sup>1</sup> and affiliated staff on the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation's Sacramento River Temperature Model (SRTM) used to develop temperature operations plans on the Sacramento River. The morning of Day 1 will provide general and technical overviews of the model. The general overview during the first hour is especially suitable for managers and non-technical staff. Participation in the remaining 1½ days of the workshop is limited to invitation only (due to limited meeting space) and will consist of hands-on sessions to instruct invited participants on how to reproduce historical scenarios using the SRTM.
