MEETING SUMMARY

1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Julie Lee called the meeting to order at 9:37 AM on August 22, 2024, at the California Natural Resources Agency Building at 715 P Street, Room 221, Sacramento, CA 95814.

2. ROLL CALL – ESTABLISH A QUORUM (WATER CODE §85210.5)

Roll call was taken, and a quorum was established. The following councilmembers were present and in person: Hueso, Mehranian, Miller, and Lee.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

4. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE DELTA SYSTEM ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION MANAGEMENT (CAL. CODE REGS., TIT. 23, § 5001 ET SEQ.) (RESOLUTION 2024-06) (ACTION ITEM)

Jeff Henderson, Deputy Executive Officer for Planning and Performance, provided background on the Ecosystem rulemaking process, the response to comments received, and the staff recommendation to adopt the proposed regulatory amendments.

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Chair Lee provided an overview of the content of the agenda item, the documents being voted on, and the process for public comment. Councilmember Zingale and Henderson discussed the public engagement process and the response to comments.

Dr. Windham-Myers highlighted a research project funded by the Delta Science Program, "Evaluating the Early Detection and Rapid Response Process for Aquatic Weeds", and a presentation on the Delta Science Program peer review of the Long-Term Operations for the Central Valley Project and State Water Project Fish and Aquatic Effects Analysis.

Dr. Windham-Myers reviewed upcoming conferences and events including:

 2024 California Water and Environmental Modeling Forum (CWEMF) Annual Meeting, which will be held at the Lake Natoma Inn in Folsom, CA on September 23-25, 2024. CWEMF is a non-profit, non-partisan organization whose mission is to increase the usefulness of models for analyzing California's water & environment related problems. • 2024 Bay Delta Science Conference which will be held in-person at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center (1401 K Street, Sacramento, CA 95814) from September 30 to October 2, 2024. Windham-Myers provided an overview of each day and the featured talks and events of the conference.
