5. Chair's Report (Information Item)

A) California Department of Water Resources (DWR) Developing Environmental Literacy, Taking Action (DELTA) Education Program

Council staff will briefly summarize last month's DELTA Education Program presentation, and DWR staff will answer councilmember questions about the program.

The Council may discuss current legislation that could affect the Council and/or implementation of the Delta Plan and may take action to express support, opposition, or seek to amend any of the bills listed in the monthly legislative report.

7. Lead Scientist's Report (Information Item)

Delta Lead Scientist Dr. Laurel Larsen will update the Council on Delta Science Program activities. The Lead Scientist Report provides the Council with unbiased advice on matters of scientific importance in the Delta. In addition, the monthly report offers an opportunity for discussion of relevant advances in science impacting the Delta and highlights Delta Science Program activities.

8. Delta Winter 2023 Flood Damage Assessment (Information Item)

MBK Engineers will describe the extent of levee damage from the 2022/2023 winter storms and the emergency response and recovery approaches taken by several reclamation districts during and following the storms. Department of Water Resources staff have been invited to comment on the funding available to support these efforts, the roles of the State and federal governments, and the need for sustainable levee funding.

9. Knightsen Wetland Restoration and Flood Protection Project (Information Item)

The East Contra Costa County Habitat Conservancy, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and Council Staff will give a presentation on the Knightsen Wetland Restoration and Flood Protection Project, a multi-objective effort to reduce flooding in the unincorporated Contra Costa County community of Knightsen, restore wetland and upland habitats for native and special status species, provide water quality benefits, and provide recreation and Delta access.

10. Preparation for the Next Council Meeting

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Public Comments
