7. San Joaquin Council of Governments Draft 2026 Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (Action Item)

Staff from the San Joaquin Council of Governments will present on their 2026 Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy and its relationship to the Delta Plan. Pursuant to the Delta Reform Act, (Wat. Code, § 85212.) the Council is required to review and provide advice on the sustainable communities strategy if the regional transportation plan includes land within the primary and secondary zones of the Delta.

8. Lead Scientist's Report (Information Item)

The Lead Scientist Report provides the Council with unbiased advice on matters of scientific importance in the Delta. In addition, the monthly report offers an opportunity for discussion of relevant advances in science impacting the Delta and highlights Delta Science Program activities.

9. Delta Independent Science Board (ISB) Update (Information Item)

To help inform Delta Stewardship Council (Council) efforts, the Delta ISB provides the Council with independent scientific advice on the Delta Plan and reports findings and recommendations from Delta ISB reviews on the scientific programs

that support adaptive management in the Delta. Delta ISB Chair Dr. Inge Werner and Delta ISB Past Chair Dr. Lisa Wainger will provide an update on the Delta ISB's current activities, including a report out on the findings of the decision-making under deep uncertainty review.
