

Summary of Requested Action

- The purpose of today's meeting is for the Council to consider the adoption of proposed regulatory amendments to Sections 5001-5015, inclusive, and the addition of Section 5005.1, Appendix 3A, 4A, and 8A to Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations
- Staff recommends that the Council approve Resolution 2024-06, by which the Council would adopt proposed regulatory amendments and authorize staff to finalize and submit rulemaking documents to the Department of Finance and Office of Administrative Law



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Policy Background

The Delta Plan and BDCP

- Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) ٠ was expected to be incorporated into the Delta Plan
- In 2015 the BDCP was partially ٠ replaced by the EcoRestore initiative
- The Council determined an ٠ amendment was necessary

Ecosystem Delta Plan Amendment

- Based on three publicly reviewed • scientific synthesis papers
- Updated core strategies, policies, ٠ recommendations, and performance measures to protect, restore and enhance the Delta ecosystem

- Public Engagement Public Council and DISB meetings
- Convened interagency committee with State and Federal invitees, including DWR, CDFW, CNRA, CVFPP, DPC, State Parks, USFWS, and NOAA
- 20+ meetings with NGOs, county representatives, agricultural groups, water suppliers, State, Federal, and local agencies


Council Adoption

- Final PEIR certified, and Ecosystem Amendment adopted at June 2022 Council meeting
- The proposed regulations presented today are based on policies approved in the Ecosystem Amendment in June 2022

Adopted by the Council in June 2022 ٠

Rulemaking Process

- On March 29, 2024, the Council initiated the formal rulemaking process
 - Notice of Proposed Action, proposed regulatory text, Initial Statement of Reasons and Economic and Fiscal Impact Analysis
 - Opened 45-day public comment period
- On May 14, 2024, staff held a duly noticed public hearing at the Natural Resources Building
- An extension of the public comment period to May 17, 2024, was requested by an interested party and granted by the Council



Overview of Proposed Regulation

Proposed changes to California Code of Regulations, title 23, division 6:

- Add required disclosure of ecosystem restoration and social benefits;
- Modify requirements for projects at tidal elevations to accommodate future marsh migration, sea level rise, and tidal inundation;
- Require projects at subtidal elevations to **safeguard against levee failure**;
- Refine locations of levee projects required to consider alternatives that improve floodplain values, and consider a broader range of alternatives than setback levees;
- Add a legacy clause for covered actions that have already started CEQA;
- Add new defined terms;
- Add Appendices with maps and details supporting proposed regulations.

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Comments Received on ISOR and Proposed Regulations

- The Council received three comment letters and comments from eight attendees at the Public Hearing
- Comment categories:
 - Coordination with Interested Parties
 - Requests for Exemption or Variance
 - Requests for Additional Guidance from the Council
 - Ambiguous Policy Language
 - Economic & Fiscal Impact of the Amended Regulations
 - Feasibility of Setback Levees
- Responses to comments provided in the Final Statement of Reasons
 - No changes to proposed regulations required



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Staff Recommendation & Next Steps

- Staff recommends that the Council approve Resolution 2024-06 to adopt proposed regulatory amendments to California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 5001 to 5015, inclusive and section 5005.1, Appendices 3A, 4A and 8A
- If approved, staff will proceed with the rulemaking process, beginning with a 30-day review by Department of Finance and followed by submission to Office of Administrative Law
- Place language in the Delta Plan and commence implementation
