Summary of DPIIC Spring Gathering

The Delta Stewardship Council (Council) established the Delta Plan Interagency Implementation Committee (DPIIC or Committee) after adopting the Delta Plan in 2013 and continues to oversee DPIIC activities as required by the Delta Reform Act. DPIIC serves as a forum to lead state, federal, and local agencies' efforts to implement the Delta Plan and Delta Science Plan. Committee members collaborate to implement their agencies' policies and authorities in ways that help achieve the co-equal goals of a more reliable California water supply and a restored, enhanced ecosystem in the Delta.

Welcome and Introductions

Chair Lee called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. at the Clarksburg Schoolhouse. Quorum was established. Warren Fox, a representative of the 1883 Clarksburg Schoolhouse, provided a brief introduction to the Clarksburg Schoolhouse. Chair Lee welcomed representatives from State Parks and the Wildlife Conservation Board to the dais. Members were asked if there were any edits to the October 28 DPIIC meeting summary; there were none. Dr. Windham-Myers gave an update on a collaborative modelling effort addressing three topics: harmful algal blooms, salinity intrusion, and tidal marsh restoration.

Diane Burgis asked questions about the impact of wildfires on water quality, monitoring and data collection needs, recreational boating, and the golden mussel. Jay Ziegler spoke to the importance of collaboration on both water quality and water supply availability.

Chair Lee introduced General Plan Manager Katie Metraux, Diablo Range District Superintendent Clint Elsholz, and District Planner Megan Harrison to provide an overview of efforts to develop the Delta Meadows State Park Property into a new state park.

Jay Ziegler highlighted the research and planning of UC Davis graduate students on the Delta Meadows Park Property.

Delta Meadows Park Property and Locke Boarding House Site Visits

Delta Meadows Park Property

Jamile Ibrahim of Stantec spoke to the work his firm is doing on behalf of the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation on the adjacent Delta Crosscut Channel and collaboration with State Parks and others during this process to incorporate recreational needs.
