Purpose

On October 3, 2024, the Delta ISB will tour Rindge Tract and Staten Island. At Rindge Tract, the Delta ISB will learn about how crops more typical of the Delta lowlands are farmed and how traditional methods of irrigation and drainage are employed. At Staten Island, the Delta ISB will learn how the land is managed to support wildlife-friendly agriculture, to protect migratory bird habitat, and about the challenges of subsidence.

In addition, the Delta ISB will receive an overview of an upcoming project by Pelican Renewables LLC, which will construct a deep injection well and related infrastructure on Rindge Tract for geologic sequestration of carbon dioxide.

5. Overview of Staten Island

Jerred Dixon, President of Conversation Farms and Ranches, and Allen Bacon, a biologist who manages the Staten Island conservation program, will lead a tour of the island, owned by The Nature Conservancy. They will provide an overview of land management practices that implement wildlifefriendly agriculture for all wildlife, with a focus on supporting key migratory bird species. Additionally, they will discuss habitat management goals related to climate change, subsidence, greenhouse gas reduction, and carbon sequestration.
