

What is Science for Communities?

Science for Communities (SFC) began in 2022 to pair Delta communities and local public agencies with academic and agency subject matter experts. These partnerships allow participants to co-generate research that addresses a particular need or desire of communities in, or with ties to, the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta (Delta). SFC uplifts the research goals of communities and provides the support needed to better understand Delta issues. Likewise, participating scientists and researchers are able to co-create knowledge with communities and better understand how scientific outcomes would benefit Delta communities.




Figure 1: Science for Communities Program Goals



Project Types

SFC projects address social and environmental issues for communities in or with ties to the Delta. For example, the 2023-24 cohort projects focused on:

- Water quality and dangers of mercury consumption through fish
- Flood risk to legacy communities in the Delta
- Harmful algal blooms
- Air quality and climate change impacts in Stockton

Benefits to Participants

For the 2025-26 SFC cohort, the Council will organize Delta communities, including tribal communities, and subject matter expert participants into teams and facilitate collaboration over the course of a year to achieve project goals.
